

Beaks and Birds: Darwin's Finches



mulating his ideas as a naturalist aboard the British survey ship H.M.S. Beagle. When the Beagle visited the Galapagos Islands in 1835, Darwin collected specimens of the local wildlife, including some finches.


Though the finches had little in fact to do with Darwin's devel-

opment of evolutionary theory, they have attracted considerable attention from modern evolutionary biologists as further evidence of natural selection. In 1970's. Peter and Rosemary Grant and their colleagues noted a 5 percent increase in beak size after a severe drought, because the finches were left with only hard-to-crack seeds. The change, though significant, was small; yet some Darwinists claim it explains how finch species originated in the first place.

A 1999 booklet published by the U.S. National Academy of Sciences describes Darwin's finches as "a particularly compelling example" of the origin of

species. The booklet cites the Grants' work, and explains how "a single year of drought on the islands can drive evolutionary changes in the finches." The booklet also calculates that "if droughts occur about once every 10 years on the islands, a new species of finch might arise in only about 200 years."



But the booklet fails to point out that the finches' beaks returned to normal after the rains returned. No net evolution occurred. In fact, several finch species now appear to be merging through hybridization, rather than diverging through natural selection as Darwin's theory requires.

Withholding evidence in order to give the impression that Darwin's finches confirm evolutionary theory borders on scientific misconduct. According to Harvard biologist Louis Guenin (writing in *Nature* in 1999), U.S. securities laws provide "our richest source of experiential guidance" in defining what constitutes scientific misconduct. But a stock promoter who tells his clients that a particular stock can be

expected to double in value in twenty years because it went up 5 percent in 1998, while concealing the fact that the same stock declined 5 percent in 1999, might well be charged with fraud. As Berkeley law professor Phillip E. Johnson wrote in *The Wall Street Journal* in 1999: "When our leading scientists have to resort to the sort of distortion that would land a stock promoter in jail, you know they are in trouble"

From Apes to Humans

Darwin's theory really comes into its own when it is applied to human origins. While he scarcely mentioned the topic in The Origin of Species, Darwin later wrote extensively about it in The Descent of Man. "My object," he explained, "is to show that there is no fundamental difference between man and the higher animals in their mental faculties" even morality and religion. According to Darwin, a dog's tendency to imagine hidden agency in things moved by the wind "would easily pass into the belief in the existence of one or more gods."

Of course, the awareness that the human body is part of nature was around long before Darwin. But Darwin was claiming much more. Like materialistic philosophers since ancient Greece, Darwin believed that human beings are nothing more than animals.

Darwin, however, needed evidence to confirm his conjecture. Although Neanderthals had already been found, they were not then considered ancestral to humans, so Darwin had no fossil evidence for his view. It wasn't until 1912 that amateur paleontologist Charles Dawson announced that he had found what Darwinists were looking for, in a gravel pit at Piltdown, England.

Dawson had found part of a human skull and part of an apelike lower jaw with two teeth. It wasn't until forty years later that a team of scientists proved that the Piltdown skull, though perhaps thousands of years old, belonged to a modern human, while the jaw fragment was more recent, and belonged to a modern orangutan. The jaw had been chemically treated to make it look like a fossil, and its teeth had been deliberately filed down

to make them look human. Pilt-down Man was a forgery.

Most modern biology textbooks do not even mention Piltdown When critics of Darwinism bring it up, they are usually told that the incident merely proves that science is selfcorrecting. And so it was, in this case - though the correction took over forty years. But the more interesting lesson to be learned from Piltdown is that scientists. like everyone else, can be fooled into seeing what they want to see.

The same subjectivity that prepared the way for Piltdown continues to plague humanorigins research. According to paleoanthropologist Misia Landau, theories of human origins "far exceed what can be inferred from the study of fossils alone and in fact place a heavy burden of interpretation on the fossil record - a burden which is relieved by placing fossils into preexisting narrative structures." In 1996. American Museum of Natural History Curator Ian Tattersall acknowledged that "in paleoanthropology, the patterns we perceive are as likely to result from our unconscious mindsets as from the evidence itself." Arizona State University anthropologist Geoffrey Clark echoed this view in 1997 when he wrote: "We select among alternative sets of research conclusions in accordance with our biases and preconceptions." Clark suggested that "paleoanthropology has the form but not the substance of science."

Biology students and the general public are rarely informed of the deep-seated uncertainty about human origins that is reflected in these statements by scientific experts. Instead, they are simply fed the latest speculation as though it were a fact. And the speculation is typically illustrated with fanciful drawings of cave men, or pictures of human actors wearing heavy make-up.



What's Going on Here?

Most of us assume that what we hear from scientists is comparatively trustworthy. Politicians might distort or shave the truth to support a preconceived agenda, but scientists, we are told, deal with facts. Sure they might sometimes get it wrong, but the beauty of science is that it's empirically testable. If a theory is wrong, this will be discovered by other scientists perform-

ing independent experiments either to replicate or disprove their results. In this way the data are constantly reviewed and hypotheses become widely accepted theories. So how do we explain such a pervasive and long-standing distortion of the specific facts used to support evolutionary theory?

Perhaps Darwinian evolution has taken on a significance in our culture that has little to do with its scientific value, whatever that may be. An indication of this was seen in the nearly universal and censorious reaction to the Kansas School Board's decision to allow room for dissent in the standard teaching of evolution (much of which, as we have just seen, is plain wrong).

According to the news media, only religious fundamentalists question Darwinian evolution. People who criticize Darwinism, we are told, want to bomb science back to the Stone Age and replace it with the Bible. The growing body of scientific evidence contradicting Darwinian claims is steadfastly ignored. When biochemist Michael Behe pointed out in The New York Times last year that the embryo "evidence" for evolution was faked. Harvard Darwinist Stephen Jay Gould admitted that he had known this for decades (as noted above) - but accused Behe

of being a "creationist" for pointing it out.

Now, although Behe supports the idea that some features of living things are best explained by intelligent design, he is not a "creationist" as that word is normally used. Behe is a molecular biologist whose scientific work has convinced him that Darwinian theory doesn't conform to observation and experimental evidence. Why does Gould, who knows Haeckel's drawings were faked, dismiss Behe as a creationist for criticizing them?

suspect that there's agenda other than pure science at work here. My evidence is the more or less explicit materialist message woven into many textbook accounts. Futuyma's Evolutionary Biology is characteristic of this, informing students that "it was Darwin's theory of evolution," together with Marx's theory of history and Freud's theory of human nature, "that provided a crucial plank to the platform of mechanism and materialism" that has since been "the stage of most Western thought." One textbook quotes Gould, who openly declares that humans are not created, but are merely fortuitous twigs on a "contingent" (i.e. accidental) tree of life. Oxford Darwinist Richard Dawkins, though not writing in a textbook, puts it even more bluntly: "Darwin

made it possible to be an intellectually fulfilled atheist."

These are obviously philosophical rather than scientific views. Futuyma, Gould, and Dawkins have a right to their philosophy. But they do not have the right to teach it as though it were science. In science, all theories – including Darwinian evolution – must be tested against the evidence.

Since Gould knows that the real embryological evidence contradicts the faked drawings in biology textbooks, why doesn't he take a more active role in cleaning up science education? The misrepresentations and omissions I've examined here are just a small sampling. There are many more. For too long the debate about evolution has assumed "facts" that aren't true It's time to clear away the lies that obstruct popular discussion of evolution, and insist that theories conform to the evidence. In other words, it's time to do science as it's supposed to be done. LSI

we are the same people- of one blood. Different types, but the same blood.



BILL MAHER ATTACKS RELIGION IN NEW MOVIE. Reviewer for Chicago Reader calls "Religulous" dumb.

SUMMARY: "Comedian" Bill Maher, who lost his "Politically Incorrect" ABC show for complimenting the 9/11 hijackers, now has a show on HBO called "Real Time." Avow-

edly left-wing, Maher impresses reviewer J.R. Jones with his ability to often prod guests deeper into an issue than the "objective" news shows. His Real Time show may be suffering though because leading conservative guests are beginning to avoid it, because of its "vociferously liberal studio audience."

Now Maher has made a film, his first, and it is a major disappointment, says Jones, who adds that the movie aims low—for laughs instead of insight. Titled Religulous, the movie attacks believers and their faith ("a neurological disease" that has to be cured before the human race destroys the planet). Jones says



that Maher avoids religious scholars and historians and prefers to highlight "fundamentalist goofballs who can be ridiculed with ease", such as truckers having strange ideas and backgrounds and an Orlando televangelist who believes Jesus was a rich man. Maher also attacks creationists and ministries that try to help homosexuals go straight.

To be fair, Jones points out, Maher does interview Dr. Francis Collins, director of the Human Genome Project, who believes science and faith can coexist, and also Rev. George Coyne of the Vatican Observatory who doesn't think the Scriptures can be used to teach science. However, these excerpts are too brief and Maher prefers "carnival attractions" like the Creation Museum in Kentucky and the Holy Land Experience in Florida where tourists can watch reenactments of the Crucifixion.

The filmmakers often insert old movie clips to serve as punch lines but the clips don't always work well. In several interviews Maher's "rude remarks" are followed by fake reaction shots of the interviewees. On-screen captions are sometimes used to debunk false statements, but at other times they are used to ridicule. However, Jones thinks these unfair tactics may be more the work of director Larry Charles than of Maher. In summarizing, Jones writers, "Religulous turns out to be a small movie about the biggest question of all: why we're here and how this all came to be."

COMMENT: Like human speech, songs, and written works, movies can be used for

good (not usually) and for evil (much more often than we would like). While I haven't seen this movie and will not likely do so, this review if at all accurate indicates that Religulous is ridiculous and not one most Christians should want to spend their valuable time watching. "The highway of the upright avoids evil; he who guards his way guards his life." Proverbs 16:17.

Atheists will probably find value in the movie in that it portrays religion in such a negative light. As one online comment following the review says, Maher should be defended for his irreverent attitude toward religion because "there is no use for serious discussion about something that includes no logic or reason."

What we Christians can continue to do is to preach the Word. Those non-Christian or weak Christian thinkers who keep an open mind may by the grace of God eventually come to the very logical conclusion that there is indeed an Intelligent Designer, a Creator God. Through the Word, they then can be led to confess their sins and accept the full and free forgiveness offered them by our Savior.

NOT EVOLUTIONIST ENOUGH. SCIENCE PROFESSOR IN ENGLAND DEMOTED

SUMMARY: Biologist Michael Reiss resigned under pressure as Director of Education of the Royal Society of London after he was quoted as saying that creationism should be taught in science classes. The BBC News reported, "He (Reiss) said his experience had led him to believe it was more effective to include discussion about creationism alongside scientific theories such as the Big Bang and evolution--rather than simply giving the impression that such children [from creationist families] were wrong."

After Reiss was attacked by colleagues inaccurately as a creationist, he and the Royal Society agreed he should resign as Director, However, Reiss had his defenders, Members of the Imperial College London and the British Association for the Advancement of



Science said Reiss should have been applauded and supported for encouraging discussion about "public misconceptions" concerning science.

The Society has stated that Reiss will return as full-time Professor of Science Education at the Institute of Education. He was even commended for his past efforts.

The Royal Society was founded in 1663 by a group of natural philosophers devoted to the advancement of science. Ironically, among them was Robert Boyle, the father

of modern chemistry and a well-known creationist.

COMMENT: Here we go again. Another apparent case of discrimination involving creationism, and the recipient of the bias in this case is not even a creationist. It certainly seems as if the leading proponents of the theory of evolution are becoming increasingly nervous about the advances of both creationism and Intelligent Design.

Just to be clear, it's my impression that most Biblical creationists do NOT want the Genesis account of creation taught in public school science classes. One can imagine the damage an atheistic or agnostic science teacher could do if forced to teach as fact a view which he regards as a myth.

On the other hand, what is wrong with teaching the scientific evidence against Darwin's theory along with the evidence for it? In fact, at least three members of the U.S. Supreme Court have endorsed this view. Opponents of teaching both sides of the issue invariably mischaracterize the concept as science vs. religion instead of pro-evolution science vs. anti-evolution science.

Like the Pharaoh of the Exodus in Old Testament times, many secular scientists and their supporters have hardened their hearts to the point that no amount of scientific evidence to the contrary can cause them to change their acceptance of the theory of evolution. But what about those evolutionist-leaning scientists who are still openminded? By the grace of God, once they understand the full range of problems with Darwin's theory, they might yet be persuaded to look for an alternative (i.e. the Word of God) for an explanation of where we came from and where we're going.

QUESTION OF THE DAY

If the rock strata were laid down as a result of Noah's Flood, why do so many of the layers lack fossils?



According to creationist geologist, Andrew A. Snelling, more rock layers may have been laid down during Day 3 of Creation Week than what Noah's Flood produced. Since plants and animals had not yet been created, these Day 3 strata could not have contained any fossils. As is the case in the Grand Canyon (photo), the fossil-less rock layers tend to be at the bottom. Regarding the third day, Genesis 1:9 states, "And God said, 'Let the water under the sky be gathered to one place, and let dry ground appear." That simple verse holds open the possibility of a major earth-shaping event at least equal to that of the

Flood. In fact, St. Peter (2 Peter 3:5-7) mentions three major earth-shaping events in the history of our planet: the Creation, the Flood, and the future destruction of the earth on the Last Day.

Older adults who take a brisk walk just three times weekly can boost their brainpower and reduce the risk of memory-robbing illnesses such as Alzheimer's disease. This is the conclusion of research done by Australian scientists. Saying No to Electronic Voting Machines

Costly electronic voting machines are being retired to warehouses all across the country because of doubts about their ability to accurately count votes, avoid breakdowns and resist hackers. Some states are trying to sell them on eBay or to third world countries or even salvage them for scrap. A few more are holding on to them in hopes they could one day be resurrected. A new worry for parents of Internet-savvy teens: digital drugs. Some Web sites are offering audio files designed to induce drug-like effects. All the listener needs is a music player and headphones. Called "idozers" or "idosers", the files produce binaural beats, a different sound in each ear which combine to create a new frequency. Leaves

"All of us have become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous acts are like filthy rags; we all shrivel up like a *leaf*, and like the wind our sins sweep us away." Isaiah 64:6. (NIV)

Most of us have seen what a leaf looks like after it dries out. It usually begins to shrivels up and isn't very pretty.


Because of our sins, we are like shriveled up leaves and even what we think are good things are really like filthy rags. But thanks be to Jesus, God doesn't see the sins of believers any more because we are all forgiven.

What is a leaf? A leaf is actually a part or organ of above-ground plants designed for photosynthesis.

What is photosynthesis and why is it important?

This is the action of the leaves of green plants in using light energy to change carbon dioxide and water into food. Not only do the leaves act like little factories in providing us with food in the form of sugar, but they also give us needed much oxygen thanks to the photosynthesis that takes place in the leaves.

What are the parts of a **leaf?** The upper and lower surfaces of a leaf are made up of layers of cells which together are called the epidermis. The epidermis has several purposes including keeping water inside the leaf. It contains openings called stomata (singular, stoma) through which water vapor and other gases can pass. Between the upper and lower epidermis is tissue called mesophyll. It is here where photosynthesis takes place. A leaf also contains veins. Veins are tubes called xvlem



if they bring water and minerals from the roots into the leaf or *phloem* if they carry sugar out of the leaf.

Do all leaves look about the same? Not nearly. We usually think of leafs as being flat. However, the leaves of pine trees are shaped like needles. Also, some leaves come in bunches like those on a fern plant (below).



Old dried up brown leaves are not worth much. But by dying for us, Jesus has made us, who by nature are like dried up leaves, worth enough to want to take us to heaven. Thank Him that He gave up His life to become our Savior

Activities: 1. Using a magnifying glass, study the veins of a leaf and see if you can spot the stomata.

2. Make a leaf rubbing. To do this, place a healthy leaf on a flat surface like a table Cover the leaf with a regular sheet of plain paper. Now rub a piece of crayon over the leaf. Using the side ofcrayon with the wrapping removed might With practice, work best. you will be able to make a nice leaf picture even if you can't draw at all

Is Evolution to Blame for Two Attacks in Finland?



ithin the past 12 months the nation of Finland has had to endure two school

massacres.

In September Matti Saari, 22, killed 9 students and one teacher at the Kauhajoki School of Hospitality.

Police are investigating possible links between Saari and Pekka-Eric Auvinen, who fatally shot eight people and himself at a high school in southern Finland in November, 2007.

The two had similar personalities and interests. They dressed the same. They both posted violent clips on You Tube before the shootings. They were both fascinated by the 1999 Columbine school shootings in Colorado. The two attacked their own schools and both committed suicide. And they likely purchased their guns at the same place.

An interesting question is whether or not they shared similar views regarding Darwin's theory. Auvinen in a video revealed he was inspired by the

theory of evolution. "I am prepared to fight and die for my cause," he said. "I, as a natural selector, will eliminate all who I see as unfit, disgraces of the human race and failures of natural selection...I have had enough."

If Auvinen and Saari shared similar interests and may have even been in contact with each other, it is certainly possible that they shared similar negative evolution-inspired feelings about the human race or, at least, some humans. Certainly, few Darwinists are led to contemplate such drastic actions. Yet, it makes sense that some students may be confused by evolution theory into thinking that as "slightly more evolved animals," they might be justified in eliminating those they see who are holding back the advancement of the human race.

It is a shame though that these events are happening especially in a country like Finland, where more than 80% of the population is officially Lutheran but reportedly few attend church regularly. If the Finns would return to their Lutheran roots with its message of hope, love and forgiveness in Christ, and forget atheistic evolution and its opinion that life has no purpose, there just might be less reason for fearing a repeat of these school massacres.
